Kindness to Animals for Children

Students learn that pet animals require daily and lifetime care and how to identify and administer to pet needs.

Animal Safety and Loss

Students learn how to approach an unfamiliar pet, to demonstrate and explain what to do if they are approached by a stray dog or cat and what to do if they encounter any other wild animal. They will be taught what steps to take to keep their pet from becoming lost, and what they can do to locate a lost pet.

Common Illnesses in Pets

Students learn to list several of the common illnesses found in cats and dogs, how to recognize when their pet is ill and know what steps they can take to help their pet recover.
